Trash and Recycling

- Redford Township will now pick up two large or bulky items for free each week on trash day! It is not necessary to call for a scheduled time.
- All clean, household plastics (containers and bags) #1 to #7, cardboard, glass jars, aluminum, steel and tin cans, and newspapers, magazines, junk mail and other papers can be put in your recycling bin.
- Yard waste may be placed in brown paper yard waste bags or in containers (35 gallon or smaller) marked "Yard Waste."

Redford Township's Blight Hotline number is 313-387-2604. If a business or home is not being maintained or the grass is over six inches, call the above number or email pride@redfordtwp.com. You need to supply a valid address and specific details about the problem. The name of the person reporting the problem will be kept confidential. If you do not notice a resolution in a week or two, call again to be sure someone takes care of the situation.
